## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT



Construction has begun on a new service station and convenience store at **7575 N Port Washington Road**.

Recently the existing tanks and existing building has been/are being removed. The project is owned by Spring North Corp. The convenience store will provide coffee, prepackage food, soda, ice cream, salad, and other similar products. The project will improve circulation to the site by provide bike parking and sidewalks. The building will be 4,275 square feet with a canopy for the fueling area. Design approvals were granted by the City in 2022.

Completion of the project is expected late 2024 or early 2025.



## BUILDING DEPARTMENT



The Building Department handles a variety of functions ranging from residential and commercial building, plumbing, electrical, and HVAC inspections for new construction and property maintenance issues. Additional functions include fire, health, and life enforcement. We also serve as a direct source for public information and education.

## PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Many residents do a good job keeping up the appearance of their homes and properties. However, there are properties located in Glendale that have perhaps "seen better days." Please be aware the City of Glendale has a Property Maintenance Code.

Chapter 15.5 was developed to prevent and correct the existence of adverse conditions and to establish certain standards relating to the appearance, maintenance, safety, and repair of all buildings and lands within the City.

A proactive approach to property maintenance by all residents will help to avoid complaints. If you feel a neighbor's property may need maintenance you are able to file a complaint by visiting [www.seeclickfix.com](http://www.seeclickfix.com).

The compliant will be reviewed by the Department of Public Works and the property will be analyzed for further action.

## Did You Know?

The City of Glendale issued 689 permits and conducted 2,820 inspections in 2023?

## COMMON INSPECTION

### *What types of items require a permit?*

Permits are required for: roofs, additions, kitchen and bathroom remodels, new furnaces, new air conditioning, new plumbing, and electrical. If you are planning a project and have questions about a permit, please call 414-228-1742.

### *When does a permit expire?*

Permits expire 18 months from the date of issuance.

### *Do I need a final inspection?*

All permits require a final inspection. If the final inspection does not occur the permit will expire, and a new permit fee is required to reopen the permit.

### *Who should call for an inspection?*

Often your service provider will apply for a permit. However, most of the time the service provider will not call for the final inspection. It is then the responsibility of the homeowner to call for the inspection. When working with a service provider discuss early-on who will be responsible for requesting and scheduling the final inspections.

### *How do I request an inspection?*

Please call 262-420-4732 or email [WIinspections@safebuilt.com](mailto:WIinspections@safebuilt.com) to request an inspection. Please have your address available and if possible, provide your permit number. Please note that the property is in Glendale. Inspections requested prior to 3:30pm can be scheduled for the following day or a day that is convenient for you.

### *How do I know if my service provider applied for a permit?*

Ask your service provider to see a copy of the issued permit. If the provider is responsible for the final inspections, ask to see the final approved paperwork.

## DRIVEWAY PERMITS

A permit is required when replacing a driveway approach, which is located within the City right-of-way. A sketch showing the width of the approach and a certificate of insurance listing the City of Glendale as **"additionally insured"** MUST be submitted with the permit application. ## HELP THE FIRE DEPARTMENT GATHER CRITICAL INFORMATION AHEAD OF AN EMERGENCY USING COMMUNITY CONNECT

North Shore Fire/Rescue (NSFR) is excited to be one of the first public safety organizations in Wisconsin to roll-out a new and innovative software that will help gather and provide critical information ahead of a call for emergency service. Beginning in 2022, NSFR began using software from First Due to assist emergency responders by providing integrated route mapping, hydrant location and other mission critical structure and occupant information for most commercial properties across the seven-community service area.

This software replaces what was previously a completely manual process of pre-planning commercial structures which often resulted in outdated data and inconsistent schematics. The software was initially designed to assist commercial stakeholders by developing consistent and helpful visualized plans with information like gas and water shut-offs, alarm panel location etc.

Now, just as exciting, private residents can also use First Due's Community Connect platform to provide the same vital information to the fire department for their residential address. Community members can create an account tied to their local address and provide information on pets, access code and door information, occupants who may need additional assistance evacuating in an emergency, electric, water and gas shut offs, and occupant or owner contact information.

Moreover, following a planned update in the coming year, residents will be able to elect to be notified via Community Connect if their home address has emergency services dispatched to it to communicate with the responding personnel. Setting up an account takes just minutes, and the self-service residential pre-plan interface is user friendly and intuitive. Additionally, the information shared is private and confidential and is held behind bank-level encryption, making it as safe as paying a bill online.

Community Risk Reduction personnel from NSFR will be able to assist residents with completing their home plans as a part of our free Home Safety Assessment Program. 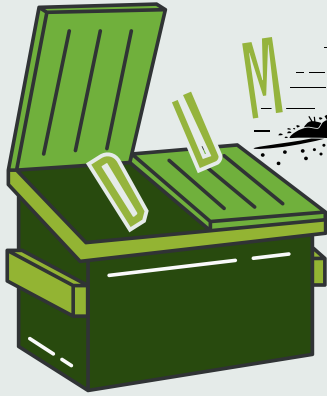

## PROPERTY TAX COLLECTION

## Tax Season



### Payment Methods

1. Payments will be accepted at City Hall Monday - Friday from 8:00am-4:30pm with the following holiday closures:
  - May 27, 2024
2. Via the drop box in the parking lot of the Police Department
3. By mail to 5909 N Milwaukee River Parkway, Glendale WI 53209
4. Online payment options are available at <https://pp-milwaukee-co-wi-fb.app.landnav.com/>. Please visit <http://www.glendalewi.gov> for instructions on how to navigate the website.

Property tax bills were mailed in early December. The bill has bar coded payment stubs to assist in processing. You should retain this copy of the tax bill for your records and return only the bar coded payment stub(s) with your payment(s).

**The second installment is due March 31, 2024 and the third installment is due May 31, 2024 respectively.** Special assessments and special charges are not eligible for the installment plan and were due January 31, 2024 along with the first installment. We recommend that you mark your calendar so that you are not late for any installment payment. No reminder notices will be sent.

There is a payment drop box located in the middle of the Police Department Parking Lot. Please note that for mailed payments the postmark governs the date of payment -- not the date on your check.

We do not automatically mail receipts. You may enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope for a mailed receipt or you can obtain tax details (a form of receipt) and duplicate tax bills online at [www.glendalewi.gov](http://www.glendalewi.gov). Payments will appear on the City website the day after they are posted.

Each permit issued requires an application. If you have two cars that you wish to park on the street, you must fill out two permit applications. **An annual fee of \$20.00 will be charged for each permit which must accompany the application.**

These permits must be affixed by their own adhesive to the inside of a window on the driver's side of the vehicle. The permits are valid from April 1, 2024 through November 31, 2024. **Enforcement will begin on April 1, 2024.**



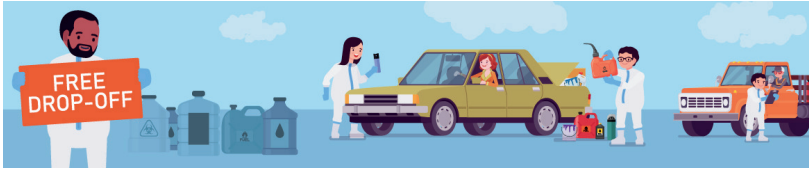

## BENEFITS OF CLEANING YOUR STORM DRAIN

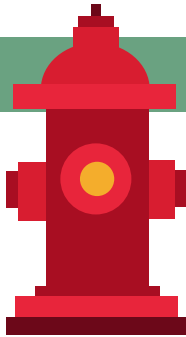
- Reduced flooding, particularly to low lying areas

## HYDRANT FLUSHING

The City of Glendale will conduct its annual water main flushing program from **April through August of 2024.**

The flushing program is designed to remove natural minerals like iron and calcium collect in the bottom of water of water mains. This operation may cause a temporary discoloration in your water supply. By allowing your water to run for a short period of time, the problem should clear itself. Please be assured, although the water may be discolored, it is safe for human use.

**The Glendale Water Utility has changed the due date for utility bills from the 20th to the 30th.**

**The quarterly bill for this year will be due on the following dates:**

- **April 30th**
- **July 30th**
- **October 30th**

As a reminder utility bills will be issued on a quarterly basis in March, June, September, and December.

Action is needed to maintain timely utility payments due to our system updates. Please take a few moments to log onto your PSN account and update your payment schedule to correspond to the upcoming due dates.

## INVASIVE PLANT DISPOSAL

This is a reminder that Wis. Stat. § 287.07(7)(cm) now contains an exception to the general prohibition on the landfill disposal of yard materials. Therefore, certain plants that are classified by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) as invasive species may be disposed of in landfills, if separated from other yard materials that are subject to the disposal ban.

May and June are prime months for landowners, maintenance crews, and volunteer groups to collect invasive plants for disposal. When disposing of these plants, the DNR recommends that you label bags containing the invasive species, e.g. "contains invasive plants."

## NOXIOUS WEEDS

The City of Glendale reminds residents that State of Wisconsin Statute Section 66.0407 and City of Glendale Ordinance Section 8.1.6, require property owners to destroy all noxious weeds on their property. Some of the more common noxious weeds include thistle, poison ivy, burdock, and ragweed. If you have questions, please call the Department of Public Works at (414) 228-1710.

## DISPOSAL OF LARGE, BULKY OR NON-HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Disposal of large furniture, mattresses, etc., is done by special collection on **Mondays ONLY**. **Residents must call GFL Environmental at (262) 679-0860 to schedule a pick-up, and to find out if any fees will apply.**

Special pick-ups must be scheduled at least a week in advance of the scheduled Monday collection.

Items may be placed at the curb on the night PRIOR to the Monday collection ONLY.

Items must be neatly piled or placed in containers to facilitate collection. All collections are done by hand so your consideration for workers is appreciated.



## No Mow Mother's Day

## YARD WASTE COLLECTION WEEKS

Reminder that the brush and yard waste program with GFL Environmental is **NOT a tree removal service.**



### What is Yard Waste? Yard Waste includes:

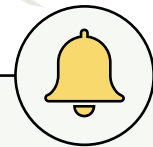
- Leaves
- Tree limbs or branches that shall not exceed four (4) inches in diameter or more than four (4) feet in length
- Brush or vegetative matter resulting from landscaping maintenance.

### When is Yard Waste Picked Up?

- Yard waste is picked up every other week. Yard waste must be out before 7:00am on the day of your regular garbage pick-up.
- Collection begins:
  - **Week A: March 24**
  - **Week B: April 1**
- Residents with questions may call GFL Environmental (the City's refuse collection) at (262) 679-0860.

### Guidelines for Yard Waste Pick-Up:

- Residents can place no more than three (3) cubic yards of Yard Waste at the curb next to their garbage for pick-up.
- **All Yard Waste must be placed in sturdy paper bags suitable for containing Yard Waste or in other suitable containers clearly marked "Yard Waste"** excluding carts or plastic bags. The weight of each container must not exceed fifty (50) pounds.
- **If Yard Waste is not placed in a suitable container, the branches shall be tied in a bundle weighing not more than fifty (50) pounds.**
- NO GRASS CLIPPINGS will be collected. Residents are encouraged to use mulching mowers or compost their own grass clippings.
- **YARD WASTE MIXED WITH TRASH WILL BE REJECTED.**
- The following materials WILL NOT be collected: stumps, root systems or parts of roots attached to brush, brush mixed with garden debris, brush generated from site clearing activities, materials resulting from tree pruning, or removal at an address other than the collection point and tree branches greater than 4" in diameter and 4' in length.
- Please refer to the City website to view the collection map.
- Reminder that burning of brush is **NOT ALLOWED.**



**REMEMBER!**

The Public Works Department reminds residents **NOT** to rake leaves, yard waste, or grass clippings to the curb in the Spring. Yard Waste and leaves will be collected as part of the Brush and Yard Waste Program offered by GFL Environmental.

## Holiday Trash Collection Schedule
